1. Supporting Prospect Hospice




2. Woodland Adventures

Our reception cohort have started 12 week outdoor learning programme with qualified forest school leader, Tamzin Henderson. They go to the wooded area by the village hall together for one morning a week and learn a range of skills such as problem solving, team work, selfexpression, independence...as well as getting generally muddy and drinking hot chocolate!

3. World Book Week

We had a wonderful book week with a visit from the author of 'Ned's Circus of Marvels', Justin Fisher. We also held a parent workshop morning with a variety of sessions, each based around a different type of poem. Children then worked on their own poems and performed them over the microphones at our very own poetry slam. We also had a go at memorising a whole poem and performing it together.





Here is an example of one of the parent comments we had after the event:

"I just wanted to say a massive well done for book week so far, the workshops were engaging for parents and children and it didn't seem to matter how old you were everyone could join in, the special bit for me was seeing how the teachers are with the children. It didn't matter what class I was in every teacher was on the same page they were energetic and enthusiastic and taught the children on their level, you could see all of the kids being drawn in. The girls have been watching Michael Rosen clips on u tube and talking about his facial expressions and repetition with worlds, the author visit had them bouncing up and down begging for a book to be ordered and in the evenings they have been discussing which type of poem they will be using in the poetry slam. I have seen a change, they come home telling me about their days be it science and mouldy bread or a new maths problem. It is so nice to hear. Also the fact I did not have to make a costume for world book day made me very happy!"



4. Numbers Count!

We have a wonderful new active mathematics curriculum that takes all children, no matter what their stage or age through the 3 modes of Mathematical learning. We begin each new unit with concrete and practical methods to help children gain conceptual understanding before moving on to pictorial and abstract Maths.

The new emphasis on Mathematical reasoning and investigation has really helped to turn maths lessons into a learning adventure where children follow a line of enquiry and are able to try out new ideas and methods.

Thanks to help from some local villagers, the children also have extra help with their multiplication tables and with their spelling. All children took place in dace workshops this term, led by one of the performers from the London theatre project – 'STOMP!'

Children learned a range of different moves and rhythms, using their own body as a percussion instrument, and then we put them all together into a final performance.

It was particularly inspiring to see a famous dancer perform live for us.

We have developed a real specialism in rhythmic styles of music at the school since local group 'Opera Luna' donated a whole set of African Djembe drums and Wiltshire Council lent us their Brazilian percussion.

Pete Francis, from STOMP commented on how advanced the children were – even those as young as four!

We were very proud of them.
