

Update on Easton Royal Footpaths – 16 November 2014

A lot of progress has been made in the last month with improving the footpaths in Easton Royal. Some of the actions are as follows:

- Lloyd Cockbain has cleared the entrance to Footpath 5 in Ram Alley.
- Simon and Beverley Turton have cut back the vegetation on Footpath 1 by the church and at the exit of their paddock, and have removed a redundant stile and repaired another. This has greatly improved access.
- Totteridge Farm has kindly cut back all the vegetation on their new permissive path running along the south side of the houses on the main road. They have also cut a path through the wood thicket.
- Wiltshire Council have cut all the vegetation in Harris Lane right back with their specialist tractor. This has transformed the lane.
- Village volunteers have assisted Paul and Ken from Wiltshire Council to install the first two kissing gates. The new gates are super - a huge improvement over the existing stiles.
- Village volunteers have removed all the vegetation from Chapel Drang, which had gradually reduced to a narrow pathway over the years.

We are extremely grateful to all those who have given up their time and energy to make this happen. A special mention goes to Barb Martin, who provided a delicious lunch to the first working party last Saturday.
